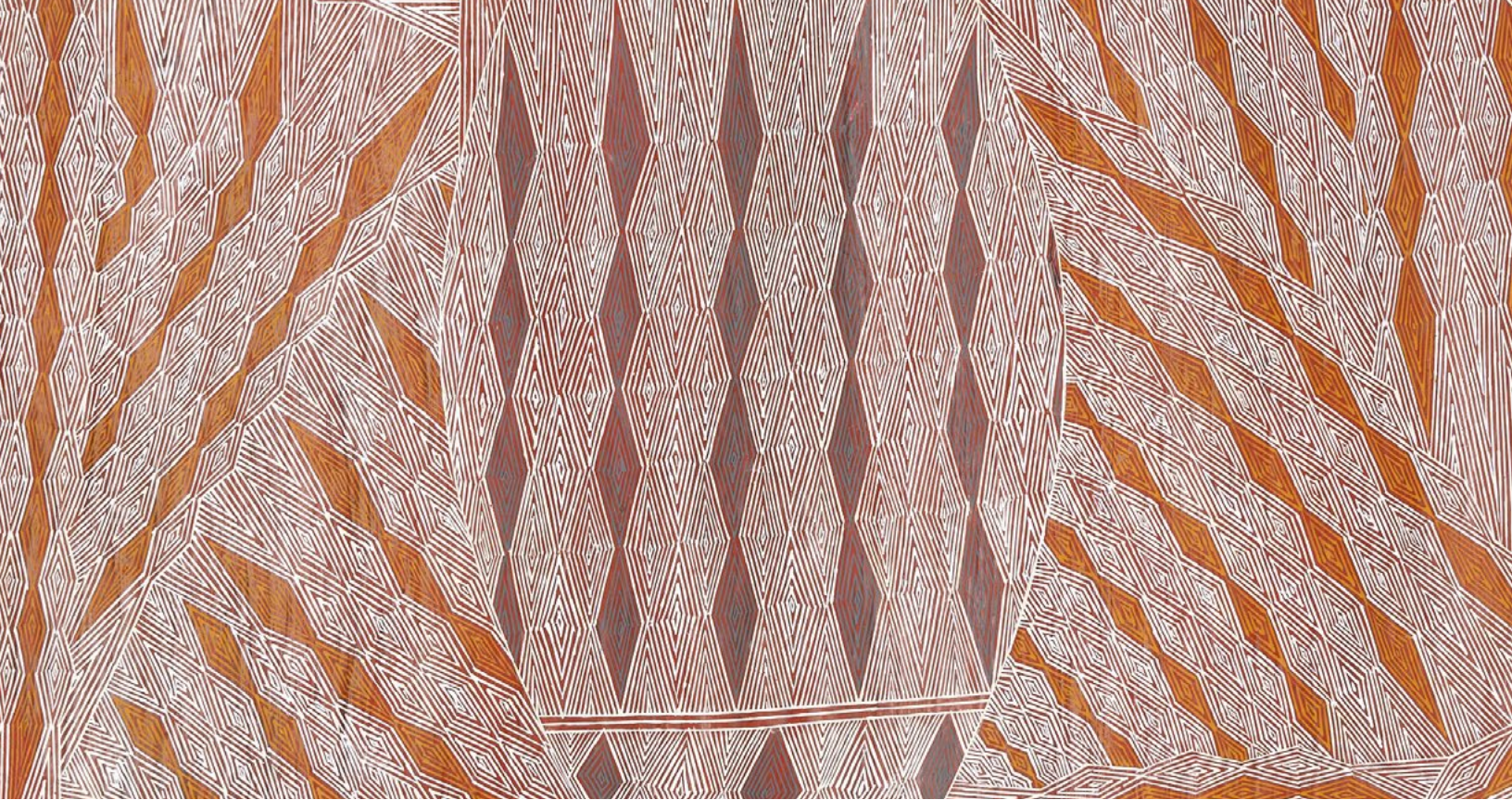

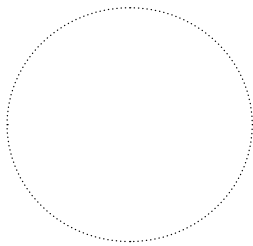


This spring, gallery walls throughout Charlottesville are being hung with Indigenous art from Australia and Oceania.
